- A. Funding Requests for Fiscal Year 2025-2026
 - 1. Piedmont Folk Legacies, Inc. (Charlie Poole Festival) \$5,000

Louise Price, President of Piedmont Folk Legacies, Inc., presented the funding request. She asked for \$5,000 to help with expenses for the festival. It will be held at Rockingham County Community College on June 12th – 14th. A symposium on the importance of Charlie Poole in the music industry and the importance the textile mills played in that in Rockingham County, will be held on June 12th and the festival will continue on June 13th and 14th. She noted the total cost for the event is \$100,000 and she is asking several organizations for funding. Last year the Town of Wentworth granted \$1,000 for the festival.

Mayor Paschal asked if there is an admission fee for the festival.

Ms. Price explained that tickets will be \$35.00/day on June 13th and 14th or \$50.00 for the entire weekend. She did not have the pricing information for the symposium on June 12th.

Councilmember Paschal asked how many have attended in the last few years.

Ms. Price said attendance has been in the hundreds but with their marketing strategy this year they are hoping for thousands. They are marketing world-wide.

There were no further questions. **Mayor Paschal** thanked Ms. Price for her presentation.

2. Wentworth PTA Ball Program - \$12,000

Betsy Kennon presented the funding request. She highlighted the following attributes of the program:

- A safe place to learn
- Somewhere outside of the classroom that kids can grow
- A break from technology
- A place to make friends with kids that don't go to the same school
- Create bonds that will last a lifetime

Councilmember Paschal asked what will be the program's largest expense going into the next season.

Ms. Kennon replied, "Within the last couple of years we've made tons of changes. We've made improvements to the fields and we've made big improvements with installing the lights. This year I'm not sure of a specific project that's slated. I know the light fee is a new occurrence that we weren't paying before, and just everything in the world costs more so it's really just trying to keep up with being able to set that level of what we've provided for so long and not make the children pay more."

Councilmember Paschal asked what the entrance fee would be this year. **Ms. Kennon** answered, "One hundred dollars (\$100), the same as what it was last year. That covers uniforms, umpires, all kinds of things."

Councilmember Daryl Crowder asked if the program has concessions at the games. **Ms. Kennon** said, "We do. It's the guy that runs the Downtown Doghouse. He comes out there and then I think The Collective is going to start coming out there as well."

Councilmember Paschal asked how many have registered so far. **Ms. Kennon** replied, "We're right at 300 I believe. I think 292 was the last number I saw and I know they've been recruiting a couple of extra. For the year, because we have our spring season and our fall season, we carry about 600 kids."

Yvonne Russell, Town Clerk/ Finance Officer, said she spoke with Diane Sawyer, Director of the program, earlier today and she explained that the program recently realized that in the past they were only considering funds that were needed for the spring season with their funding requests instead of both the spring and fall seasons, and that is why they are asking for more funds this time.

There were no further questions. **Mayor Paschal** thanked Ms. Kennon for her presentation.

3. Museum & Archives of Rockingham County (MARC) - \$10,000

CJ Idol, Director of MARC, presented the funding request. He gave the following update of completed and upcoming repairs for the museum:

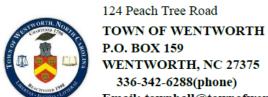
- The HVAC project has been completed with funds from the NEH, Rockingham County and with a grant of \$733,000 from the NC State Legislature. The museum was closed most of last year due to these repairs and they are now working to reopen.
- They have replaced the 1970's roof and are looking to replace part of the 1907 roof as well.
- The fire alarm needs to be replaced.
- They are looking at renovating some the exhibit galleries and the entranceway.

Mr. Idol explained that even though the museum was closed for most of last year, they were still able to work on programs and build partnerships with Piedmont Folk Legacies and Visit ROCO (Rockingham County). They introduced a murder mystery event at the Wright Tavern as a program experience. They've worked on the creative arts trail with some of the artistic organizations in the county. He said they have a reopening date of Fall 2025 penciled in. They are expecting to get the American Battlefields Trust Traveling Revolutionary War Exhibit in preparation for next year when they will be celebrating the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution. They also just received word from the State they have received funding for a Revolutionary War exhibit that will be free and open to the public for 2026 and then become part of the museum's regular rotating exhibit galleries.

Mayor Paschal asked if the museum would try to open in the Fall of 2025 even if they still have some repairs going on. **Mr. Idol** replied, "Yes, some things like the roofs and some of the exhibit galleries may not be open yet but even if we are open we can keep doing those renovations because they shouldn't be a hazard to anybody."

There were no further questions. **Mayor Paschal** thanked Mr. Idol for his presentation.

Complete Description of the Project:

This request addresses two areas of immediate need at the MARC: 1) general operating funds and 2) community programming.

- 1) As with previous years, one component of our request is the immediate need for general operating funds. Attached is the operating 2024 budget with the profit and loss report integrated from the previous fiscal year. As a 501c(3) non-profit, the MARC relies on the restricted \$50,000 per annum stipend from Rockingham County Government for utility bills and the generosity of public and private philanthropy to cover salaries, bare essential operating costs and keeping the doors open, estimated this year to be \$173,410. With those essential operating costs increasing and funds from the County limited, we respectfully ask that as our host Town, Wentworth continue to support the MARC and the historical and community work we do by giving \$7,000 towards our operating budget.
- 2) The MARC is seeking to build on its programming with the focus on families and youth groups. Some of our programs this past year included: music, economics, and Civil Rights histories. We continued our partnership with Piedmont Folk Legacies' Charlie Poole Festival, held at Rockingham Community College. We hosted a traveling exhibit on the 1940s highlighting life in Rockingham County and those who served in World War II. We also put together a memorial exhibit in honor of Rockingham County Historian, Bob Carter, which displayed his publications and areas of Rockingham County history he was most interested in. We began to redevelop our programmatic offerings with the hiring of Cameron Stewart as Operations and Programs Manager. One of the new programs we were able to implement in 2024 was a Murder Myster at Wright Tavern, which sold out.

Despite the 1907 Courthouse being closed most of the year for HVAC renovations, we were able to offer some programing throughout the year. Including welcoming the Wentworth Woodhouse Chief Executive Office and their Board President to discuss their own going regeneration of Wentworth Woodhouse. We were able to increase our partnerships with other organizations around the county, attending Riverfest with Visit RoCo and providing a presentation on the peoples and culture of the Dan River, for the Dan River Basin Association for their Dan River Weekend. We look forward to continuing our partnerships and being able to welcome everyone back into the 1907 Courthouse later this year

How will the funds be used?:

We are requesting a total of \$10,000, \$7,000 towards operating expenses and \$3,000 towards community programming. Should we be successful in our request, we would provide full mandated update and expenditure reports and further details on program costs as the projects is developed further. In addition, acknowledgement of the Town of Wentworth's support will be included on our website and all other marketing materials to declare our mutual commitment to community engagement, educational enrichment and historical preservation of the history of Wentworth and the County.

How will the project benefit the community?:

By investing in the MARC, we can continue providing a history museum and archives for all, where artifacts, images and oral histories are not only preserved, but representative of the community, accessible in a central repository, and presented in a series of engaging and thought-provoking cultural experiences. With exhibits and programs ranging from precontact Native tribes, to civil rights, textiles to law and order, the project grant would also help the MARC continue to supplement County curriculums and improve our offering as an invaluable educational resource, especially for underprivileged schools. As the only brick and mortar tourist destination in Rockingham County, the MARC has a demonstrated history of being able to bring people from around the country to Wentworth. As the MARC's profile continues to grow, we are beginning to see increased interest from an international audience of people wanting to collaborate with the MARC. All of this serves to bring more revenue to the business located in Wentworth and raise the town's own profile. Finally, support by the Town of Wentworth would also be a declaration of support for Wentworth residents' health and well-being; the MARC having proven to be a popular recreational space, providing much needed leisure activities hosting family and outdoor events, as well as the venue for a variety of organizational group meetings, affirming the MARC as a cohesive community institution.

 - 4. Rockingham County High School Band Boosters \$10,000

Christine Dohm, Director of RCHS Band Boosters, presented the funding request along with Eli Wright, RCHS Director of Bands. Ms. Dohm noted the band booster's mission is to support all of the bands at RCHS. She said they've only been able to support the band just enough to keep it going, but at this point they are looking at some advanced needs to improve instruments and storage.

Mr. Wright stated he is not only the Director of Bands at RCHS but also an alumni, and some of the instruments that are still there are the instruments that were there when he was a student band member. He said he was a tuba and trombone player, and the tuba he played is still there.

Mr. Wright explained the \$10,000 they're requesting would cover the cost of two French horns and two tubas. They currently have one French horn that is not able to be repaired. He said it is to the point that the \$5,000 he gets from the school would be eaten up just by needed repairs.

Councilmember Paschal asked what each individual instrument would cost.

Mr. Wright answered, "The French horns are about \$1,500 apiece. I do get an educational discount that I didn't factor in. I found out after the fact. The tubas are probably a little more than \$4,000 apiece, but with that educational discount as well."

There were no further questions. **Mayor Paschal** thanked Ms. Dohm and Mr. Wright for their presentation.

Organizational Goals and Objectives

The Rockingham County High School Band Program (RCHS Band) is a comprehensive music program with school curriculum and extracurricular components. School programs are open to any student enrolled at Rockingham County High School, while the Marching Band program is expanded to include 8th grade students at Rockingham County Middle School and students at Rockingham County Early College High School. Currently 70 students participate in one or more Band programs.

Band Programs at RCHS include Concert Band, Jazz Band, Wind Ensemble, and Marching Band. School band classes perform at concerts at the end of each semester which are open to the public. The RCHS Wind Ensemble attends MPA (Music Performance Adjudication) competition each year and received a grade of Excellent in 2024. The RCHS Marching Band participates in 4-5 area competitions each year and performs at varsity football home games. A Pep Band supports the football team at home and in-county away games. The Marching Band has also participated recently at local functions including Wentworth Christmas in the Park, Reidsville Christmas Parade, Draper Christmas Parade, Caroling for Cans, and local Press events.

RCHS Band Boosters is a 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to providing support for all band programs at Rockingham County High School from an organizational and financial perspective. The Boosters are made up of parents, relatives and friends of students in any of the band programs.

Project Description

At this time, the RCHS Band programs are not funded by Rockingham County Schools or Rockingham County High School beyond \$5,000 provided for instrument repair. The current band program requires \$25,000-\$30,000 per year to fund basic needs. Of this amount, about 50% is raised through fees charged for Marching Band participation. The remainder is funded through donations and fundraising by the RCHS Band Boosters. The current level of fees and fundraising covers operational expenses but is not sufficient for long-term improvements to instruments, uniforms, or equipment.

The RCHS Marching Band is wearing uniforms which were purchased in 2014 at a cost of about \$40K. These uniforms show the wear and tear of 10+ years of use and need replacement.

Instrumentation is a serious issue. While most smaller instruments are owned by the students, larger instruments such as Tubas, French horns and Percussion are owned by the Band. Many of these instruments are in extremely poor shape due to age and frequency of use. In addition, the number of instruments owned by the Band would not support any significant increase in participation, which prevents the Band from growing as it should. The Band Directors of RCHS have frequently had to borrow and trade with other schools to properly equip the students.

The RCHS Band Boosters own and maintain two trailers which store and transport props, percussion and large instruments to off-campus events for Rockingham County High School and Middle School band programs. These trailers need upgrading and repair. There is a significant need for longer-term storage for the band to reduce the wear on the trailers.

Project Benefit

French Horn: The school only owns one and it is in no shape to even consider repairing. It is quite literally falling apart little by little every day. The French Horn is a very temperamental instrument that requires precision to play in tune. If something is bent, broken, detached or out of line it makes the instrument very difficult to play.

Tuba: Our best concert tuba has no case, and due to open storage has a broken valve and a rip in the bell. The Band owns two other tubas, once of which is in a similar state to the French Horn listed previously. Tuba is the foundation of any Concert Band. Without it, the ensemble sounds hollow and lacks depth. Tubas are also one of the more expensive brass instruments required for Band, so every student that plays tuba uses school owned instruments.

Uniform Replacement

An "economy" uniform replacement, with simple jackets, gauntlets, plumes and shakos would start at \$20-25K for 100 uniforms. These uniforms would not have the 7–10-year wear life that we have enjoyed with our current uniforms, so we would need to prepare for a similar cost in 4-5 years.

In both cases above, this cost does not include bibbers (overall style pants), marching shoes, gloves, and yearly maintenance (replacement buttons, dry cleaning, repair).

5. Rockingham County Food Coalition - \$1,000

Neil Jacques and **Ann Fish** presented the funding request. **Mr. Jacques** thanked Council for their support over the years. He noted this is the 15th year of the countywide food drive. **Ms. Fish** passed out a brochure listing the organizations they work with.

Mr. Jacques told Council about a donation he received from someone last week. He said a gentleman at church gave him some money to donate to the food drive. He looked down at the money expecting to see \$20 or \$50, but it was two \$100 bills. He said this guy is not someone in need of assistance but he also not someone with a lot of money, and that it always warms his heart when people are willing to do that. He also mentioned Rockingham County Fire Marshal Melissa Joyce, who after seeing how bare the veterans food pantry on Cherokee Camp Road was, she donated food and challenged staff at her office to donate as well. In last year's food drive they collected 788 pounds of food.

Mr. Jacques mentioned that the hurricane relief efforts for Western NC have slowed down the local food donations that they would have ordinarily gotten.

Councilmember Paschal III said, "We appreciate all that you do."

7. Fine Arts Festival Association (FAFA) - \$3,000

Julie Talbert, Executive Director, presented the request. She thanked Council for hearing their request and for their funding for last year's festival. She gave Council a booklet from that event.

Ms. Talbert said, "Since last year in July, we have started a new series of pop-up events where artists can showcase their art and have the opportunity to sell, show, and have conversations with other artists and the general public. We've had two of those so far. We did one in Eden last July called Watercolors on Washington, and we just did one in Reidsville called Picturing Possibilities. We have our festival in Wentworth. We are very excited that this year the festival is going to be held at the new Center for Workforce Development at Rockingham Community College."

She explained they are hoping to have more than the 200 pieces of art they had at last year's festival due to a change in the age requirements. Before, the age limit was 16 and up; this year entry will be open to anyone in high school and up. There will also be a special prize for best work of art under the age of 21.

Ms. Talbert said they are going to be holding another pop-up event in Western Rockingham County soon and a car show in Wentworth called Auto Artistry. They may have a pop-up at the Charlie Poole Festival for their quilting artists. She added they are requesting \$3,000 this year to help increase the arts in Rockingham County and increase opportunities for the artists.

Randy Hunt, Director of the Board, addressed Council. He mentioned the wonderful job Ms. Talbert has done increasing the visibility of the Fine Arts Festival Association, and how much the Board has grown. He said if they keep going on their current trajectory they may outgrow their headquarters on Cherokee Camp Road and that they certainly enjoy being in Wentworth.

There were no questions. **Mayor Paschal** thanked them for their presentation.

8. Rockingham County Sheriff's Office (patrol vehicle) - \$40,794

Mayor Paschal clarified that the Town's contract with the Rockingham County Sheriff's Office includes the purchase of a patrol vehicle for the Wentworth Deputy and that this is not a typical funding request.

Captain Jennifer Brown explained that the Wentworth Deputy was in a car accident by no fault of his own. He sustained some injuries but is doing fine. The patrol vehicle, however, was totaled. The Sheriff's Office is requesting the funds to replace the vehicle.

Mayor Paschal noted the material in the agenda packet shows the insurance paid out about \$10,085. He asked Captain Brown to review the quotes for a new vehicle.

Captain Brown said they received three quotes and noted the most reasonable quote was from Parks Auto Group which would be \$40,794 after the insurance pay out. The vehicle is a 2025 Police Interceptor, very similar to the 2017 model that it would be replacing.

Mayor Paschal asked what the cost of additional patrol equipment would be.

Captain Brown said the total cost for the vehicle and equipment is \$50,879 which includes a 5% increase just in case the price increases before they are able to order the vehicle.

Mayor Paschal made a **MOTION**, "To approve \$40,794 for a new patrol vehicle for the Town of Wentworth."

Mayor Pro Tem Conner seconded the motion.

Councilmember Paschal III asked which budget line item the patrol vehicle would be paid out of.

Ms. Russell said they could amend the budget to transfer the funds from Miscellaneous Other Operating Costs to Public Safety/Law Enforcement.

Mayor Paschal asked if there was any further discussion. There was none. He asked for a vote. All voted in favor and the motion carried.
